Student residency classification will be in accordance with the provisions of the *Illinois Community College Act* and the administrative rules of the Illinois Community College Board. Kishwaukee College will establish procedures in accordance with same to implement this policy. (See Kishwaukee College Catalog)

## **In-District Resident**

An individual shall be considered a resident student who:

- 1. has attained his or her fully majority (age 18 or married) and resides in Illinois Community College District 523 for at least 30 days prior to the start of the term for which they wish to register
- 2. lives with his or her parents or legal guardian in Illinois Community College District 523
- 3. is an emancipated minor and resides in Illinois Community College District 523 for at least 30 days prior to enrollment as a full-time student
- 4. Exceptions:
  - a. those students who, according to State of Illinois law, may be charged in-district tuition and fees

No student shall become a resident on the basis of attendance at Kishwaukee College.

## **Out-of-District Resident**

An individual who resides in Illinois but is not a resident of Illinois Community College District 523 as defined above is considered an out-of-district resident and will be assessed the appropriate tuition. Out-of-district students shall not be required to pay higher tuition than that required for in-district students, provided these students comply with existing community college laws relative to chargebacks to sending districts.

## **Out-of-State Resident**

An individual who resides in another state at the time of application and does not subsequently qualify as a resident as previously defined is considered an out-of-state resident and will be assessed the appropriate tuition.

## **Northern Illinois University Student**

Current Northern Illinois University students, with appropriate documentation of their enrollment and United States citizenship status, can attend Kishwaukee College at in-district rates.
