- Course Revisions Feedback
 - Course revision underway for Communications 108--Communication in the Workplace and English 109--Intro to Technical Report Writing based on business partner feedback.
- Department Updates and Initiatives
 - Skills USA program has started
 - Flink (Kish faculty) proposed selling advertising on students' competition shirts to reduce costs for students.
 - Proposed levels: Bronze (\$500), Silver (\$1,000), and Gold (\$1,500).
 - Business partners expressed support for Skills USA overall and for the sponsorship idea.
 - Faculty will follow up to provide additional details.
 - Banners
 - Business partners asked for updates on the banner project and offered assistance from their teams if needed.
 - Berek stated that she would resume work on the project and work to update the committee soon.
- Planning for Spring 2026 Semester
 - Open part-time faculty position for evening hydraulics class; applicants can apply online through Kish website.
- CDL for DPT students
 - Two classes were held in 2024, each with seven students.
 - Four students enrolled for Fall 2025, trained in manual and automatic trucks.
 - Summer 2026 semester will offer an extended class option with training for Commercial Learner's Permit (CLP).

- Rev Up Grant
 - Grant concluded on June 30, 2025; all funds were expended.
 - Electric vehicle curriculum was introduced in spring 2025 and will continue in the program moving forward.
- Partner Updates
 - Deller (West Side Tractor) stated a slow start to the year, strong growth in business since April/May of 2025. Currently has 3 Kishwaukee College interns.
 - Business partners mentioned the challenges in keeping up with current technology in subscription based diagnostic information systems.
 - Roubisoff (Rochelle RTC) would like the College to explore the possibility of implementing a dedicated program for servicing refrigeration transportation units:
 - Rochelle RTC is one of the few independent shops servicing these units and is seeing increased demand.
 - Several customers of Rochelle RTC expressed willingness to donate units for training purposes.
 - Rochelle RTC offered to share the Mitchell software diagrams for older truck models with the DPT program if needed.
- Other Updates
 - Interview Day is planned for Tuesday, March 3, 2026, with Advisory meeting to follow.
 - Gregory (Kish) informed business partners about the Illinois Community Work Study (ICWS) grant funding which will reimburse 50% of student internship wages (up to \$16 per hour for up to 300 hours).
