EIU Requirements: All courses with an asterisk* require a grade of "C" or better.

To meet degree completion at EIU at least 60 additional credit hours will need to be completed. EIU requires two courses in single Foreign language.

Admittance into the EIU elementary education program requires a minimum between 2.65 cumulative GPA and passing score on ILTS Test of Academic Proficiency (or ACT/SAT waiver). In addition to applying to EIU, students must also apply to be admitted to the elementary education program. Application deadlines are as follows: March 1 (fall term) and October 1 (spring term).
